MEETING MINUTES

Greater Boroughs Partnership for Health (GBPH) Advisory Board Agenda November 17, 2021at 2:30pm by Zoom

2:36 - Call to Order

Ms. Black called the meeting to order. A roll call of voting members took place; Kristin Black, Jennifer Sullivan, Heather Alker, Chief Joe Flanagan, all present.

2:40 – Contracted Nursing Services

Ms. Black reviewed staffing updates. There is a new part time Public Health Nurse named Jim Frederick who will be starting November 22. He will be available for various areas of support.

Ms. Black reminded everyone that the PCR testing machine is up and running and is available for municipal employees in the towns that are part of GBPH. A brief discussion about COVID-19 testing and flu clinic planning continued. Please refer to the attached PowerPoint presentation.

2:45 – Mass. Department of Public Health's Funding for Local health support for COVID-19 case investigation and contact tracing

DPH did their second round of the contact tracing grant. Kristin Black received notification on November 8 of the award amount which is \$160,000 per year for FY22 and FY23. A requirement of the grant is that a part time epidemiologist is hired by Northborough.

Jennifer Sullivan moved to accept the grant with Northborough as the host town. Joe Flanagan seconded the motion, all in favor.

Kristin Black made a motion to contract the nursing services for the grant through Salmon VNA. Heather Alker seconded the motion, all in favor.

Jennifer Sullivan made a motion to accept the epidemiologist job description as written. Joe Flanagan seconded, all in favor.

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3:01- Review of Public Health Excellence Budget and Workplan

A discussion regarding remaining FY22 funds took place. Kristin Black spoke about a proposal received from BME Strategies to work towards Public Health Accreditation. Northborough would sign a contract with BME Strategies for Public Health Accreditation Support. BME could also potentially help the health departments seek additional funding. Chelsea Malinowksi joined the meeting. A discussion about the revised budget continued.

Jennifer Sullivan moved to accept the revised budget. Joe Flanagan seconded the motion, all in favor. Ms. Black will plan to invite BME to a future meeting to present a proposal so that each Board of Health can get additional information.

3:11 - Additional Funding Opportunities

Kristin Black provided a brief update regarding the FDA Retail Program Standards grant. Diane Legere will work through the self-assessments for the FDA Retail Program Standards grant which will provide eligibility for other grants as well. A brief discussion continued.

Future meetings are tentatively scheduled for December 8th, March 9th, and June 8th. All attendees agreed that having the meetings remotely work best for now.

 - Town of Northborough received award on 11/8 with reduced amount of \$160,000 per year for FY22 and FY23
- Revised budget (included in Outlook Meeting invite)
 - \$90,000 for contracted nursing services ~1 FTE
 - Additional balance of FY22 could be applied to per diem nursing
 - \$32,300 for 19-hr/week Epidemiologist to be hired by Northborough
 - \$7,700 (0.08 FTE) for Shared Services Coordinator
 - 15% administrative support line item (same as PHE grant)
