

What is a Complete Street?



- → Designed and operated to make travel safe, comfortable, convenient, and accessible for people of all ages, abilities, and travel modes.
- → Designing streets with these principles contributes toward:
 - Safety, health, economic viability and quality of life in a community by improving the pedestrian and vehicular environments.
 - Providing safer, more accessible and comfortable means of travel between home, school, work, recreation and retail destinations helps promote more livable communities.

MassDOT Complete Streets Program



→Program Purpose & Goals

- Educate Municipal & Transportation Professionals on Complete Streets
- Promote Adoption of Complete Streets Policy
 - » Northborough Complete Streets Policy adopted on January 10, 2022
- Increase Adoption of Strategic & Comprehensive Complete Streets Plans
 - » In process now
- Implement Complete Streets Policies & Plans
 - » Future phase: receive up to \$500,000 in construction funding from MassDOT to implement projects





MassDOT Complete Streets Program

→Eligible project types

- Environment & Streetscape: street lighting, bicycle parking, street trees or landscaping, stormwater management
- Intersection Redesigns: roundabouts, curb extension, intersection signalization
- Pedestrian & Bike Network Connections: shared-use paths, bike lanes, sidewalks
- Pedestrian Crossing Modifications: ADA-compliant curb ramp, Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons, crossing islands, pedestrian signal upgrades
- Street Configuration & Traffic Calming: lane elimination, lane narrowing, traffic calming measures
- Transit Investments: transit station/stop access improvements, bus lanes, bus pullouts

Northborough Complete Streets Policy



→Adopted January 2022

- →Policy focuses on making roads easily navigable by people of all ages and abilities
- → Received a \$35,200 technical assistance grant from MassDOT to develop a prioritization plan

COMPLETE STREETS POLICY

I. VISION & PURPOSE:

The purpose of Northborough's Complete Streets policy is to accommodate all road users by creating a road network that meets the needs of individuals utilizing a variety of transportation modes. The Town of Northborough will, to the maximum extent practicable, design, construct, maintain, and operate all streets to provide for a comprehensive and integrated street network of facilities that are safe for all users of all ages and abilities, including children, families, older adults, and individuals with disabilities, as a matter of routine. This policy directs decision-makers to consistently plan, design, and construct streets to accommodate all anticipated users including, but not limited to pedestrians, bicyclists, motorists, emergency vehicles, and commercial vehicles.

Why is Northborough Preparing the Prioritization Plan?




- →To help the community think about how roads and safety can be improved and made more accessible for pedestrians, bikes, cars and alternate modes of transportation
- → Eligible for funding from Mass DOT to help with implementation of projects identified in the Approved Plan (up to \$500k in any rolling four-year period)
- → Applications due in May and October





Northborough Prioritization Plan Development

- →Identified potential projects through public process
 - Initial list of projects identified by Town officials during a June 2nd workshop
 - Feedback collected from local residents via community survey
- → Review feedback and develop final list of projects
- → Prioritize and rank final projects based on:
 - Town Complete Street Policy goals
 - MassDOT's Complete Street Eligible Infrastructure list
 - Northborough's specific prioritization criteria
 - Feedback from residents and Town representatives





Complete Streets Community Survey

→Feedback collected from local residents via community survey

- Available from August 15th August 29th
- →808 resident responses
- →Responses used to identify and prioritize potential projects




→Identify your top two infrastructure impediments to walking








→What two bicycle amenities do you feel are most needed?

- 53% of responses included "sidewalk"
- 22% of responses included "traffic"
- 17% of responses included "bike" or "bicycle"
- 13% of responses included "light" or "lighting"
- 12% of responses included "speed" or "calming"
- 10% of responses included "intersection"




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Northborough Complete Streets Prioritization Plan



- → Project types in Plan include:
 - Bike lanes and/or shared arrows
 - Bike racks
 - Bump outs and other traffic calming measures
 - Multi-purpose trails or paths
 - Shoulder widening
 - Sidewalk construction, extension, and/or replacement
 - » ADA detectable warning plates, crosswalks, RRFB
 - Street lighting
 - Street trees
 - Turning lane reconfiguration






Northborough Complete Streets Prioritization Plan Project – Common Design Elements



- \rightarrow Pedestrian ramps with ADA detectable warning plates proposed at all street crossings
- → Rectangular Rapid-Flashing Beacons (RRFBs) proposed where necessary
- → Shared Arrows proposed for bicyclist use
- \rightarrow Bump outs used to calm traffic, reduce lane width

Allen Street – New Sidewalk

- Construct new bituminous sidewalk on Allen Street from East Main Street to existing sidewalk on the bridge.
- Estimated Project Cost: \$50,000 \$75,000








Aqueduct Bridge – Multi-Use Trail

- Construct multi-use trail from Hudson Street across Assabet River to the Aqueduct.
- Estimated Project Cost: >\$500,000



Aqueduct Trail – Multi-Use Trail

- Construct 12' wide bituminous multi-use trail including pedestrian ramps with detectable warning plates.
- Estimated Project Cost: >\$500,000








Bartlett Street – Bike Lanes

- On Bartlett Street, provide new bike lane (all Sections), widen existing shoulders of road (Sections 1 and 4), provide new on-road path (Sections 1 and 2).
- Estimated Project Cost: \$175,000 \$265,000



Bartlett & Maple Streets – Intersection Improvements

- Combine separate left and right turning lanes out of Maple onto Bartlett Street into one land to allow for better sight distances. Provide additional signage to discourage large tractor tailer trucks from entering Maple Street.
- Estimated Project Cost: \$2,500 \$5,000








Bearfoot Road – New Sidewalks


- Provide shared pedestrian/bike path along Barefoot Road from Industrial Park to Solomon Pond Road.
- Estimated Project Cost: >\$500,000



Blake Street – Street Lighting

 Provide street lighting and street trees along Blake Street from West Main Street to Pierce Street, curbing and grassed bump-out to reduce roadway width, curbing and grassed esplanades to reduce curb cuts, and benches and bike racks near West Main Street.









Chesterfield Road – Crosswalk Improvements

- Provide pedestrian ramps with detectable warning plates at crosswalks across Chesterfield Road and Northgate Road. Provide RRFB at Chesterfield Road and Northgate Road Crosswalks.
- Estimated Project Cost: \$25,000 \$50,000



Church Street – Sidewalk Replacement

- Remove existing sidewalk and construct new bituminous sidewalk on Church Street from Howard Street to Pleasant Street. Provide RRFB at Church Street crosswalk.
- Estimated Project Cost: \$55,000 \$80,000







Davis Street – New Sidewalk

- Construct new bituminous sidewalk on Davis Street from Lanthorn Road to existing sidewalk on Hamilton Road.
- Estimated Project Cost: \$85,000 \$150,000









Gale Street – New Sidewalks

- Construct new bituminous sidewalk on Gale Street from South Street to existing sidewalk on Monroe Street.
- Estimated Project Cost: \$60,000 \$90,000



Gale Street – Street Lighting

- Provide street lighting and street trees on Gale Street from South Street to Monroe Street.
- Estimated Project Cost: \$50,000 \$75,000







Howard Street – Sidewalk Replacement

- Remove existing sidewalk and construct new bituminous sidewalk on Howard Street from Washburn Street to Church Street.
- Estimated Project Cost: \$200,000 \$300,000



Hudson Street – New Sidewalks

- Construct new concrete sidewalk on Hudson Street from Trinity Church to existing sidewalk on Centre Drive.
- Estimated Project Cost: \$20,000 \$30,000








Lincoln Street – Sidewalk Replacement

- Remove existing sidewalk and construct new bituminous sidewalk on Lincoln Street from Pleasant Street to West Main Street.
- Estimated Project Cost: \$250,000 \$365,000



Lyman Street – Bike Lanes

- Provide new bike lanes with pavement markings and signage on Lyman Street from Bartlett Street to Watson Park.
- Estimated Project Cost: \$155,000 \$235,000







Maple Street – New Sidewalk

- Construct new bituminous sidewalk on Maple Street from Ridge Road to Bartlett Street.
- Estimated Project Cost: \$175,000 \$250,000








Pierce Street – Street Lighting

- Provide street lighting and street trees on Pierce Street from Hudson Street to Blake Street.
- Estimated Project Cost: \$65,000 \$95,000



Pierce Street – Sidewalk Replacement

- Remove existing sidewalk and construct new concrete sidewalk on Pierce Street from Hudson Street to Railroad. Construct new concrete sidewalk on Pierce Street from railroad to existing sidewalk on Blake Street.
- Estimated Project Cost: \$40,000 \$60,000








Pinehaven Drive – New Sidewalks

- Construct new bituminous sidewalks on Pinehaven Drive from West Main Street to Shadylane Avenue and from Lincoln Street to Shadylane Avenue.
- Estimated Project Cost: \$50,000 \$75,000



Pleasant Street – Sidewalk Replacement

- Remove existing sidewalk and construct new bituminous sidewalk on Pleasant Street from Church Street to Lincoln Street.
- Estimated Project Cost: \$225,000 \$325,000








River Street – New Sidewalk

- Construct new bituminous sidewalk on River Street from Main Street to existing sidewalk on bridge.
- Estimated Project Cost: \$75,000 \$100,000









South Street – Sharrows

- Provide shared-use arrows on South Street from Main Street to Ellsworth McAfee Park.
- Estimated Project Cost: \$15,000 \$25,000



South Street – Sidewalk Replacement

- Remove existing sidewalk and construct new concrete sidewalk on South Street from Main Street to Gale Street.
- Estimated Project Cost: \$35,000 \$50,000








Townwide – Bike Racks

- Provide new bike racks at Public Locations including Library, Fire Station, Town Hall, Watson Park, Assabet Park, and Memorial Field.
- Estimated Project Cost: \$15,000 – \$30,000









- →Obtain public feedback on projects and discuss evaluation criteria as part of tonight's public information & input session.
- →Woodard & Curran & municipal staff will rank identified projects using the following evaluation criteria:
 - Benefits all users, incomes and abilities
 - Enhances/creates a safe route to school
 - Links neighborhoods to shopping, recreation areas and/or public facilities
 - Addresses gap in sidewalk network
 - ADA accessibility improvement
 - Benefits public health and the environment
 - Safety improvement
 - Shovel-ready project
 - Low-cost project or project with external funding opportunities
 - Identified as priority project via public input.







- →Present Complete Streets Prioritization Plan, including rankings, to the Board of Selectmen for review and approval.
- →Once approved by the Board of Selectmen, submit final Complete Streets Prioritization Plan to MassDOT for review and approval.
- →Once approved by MassDOT, Town is eligible to submit funding requests for the construction of priority Complete Streets projects not to exceed \$500,000 within a 4-year period.


